Northern Saw-Whet Owl Banding Station

Friday and Saturday, November 4 and 5 • 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

Free Native Trees for Wildlife

Wednesday through Saturday, November 9 through 26,
(excluding November 24 and 25) • 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Stop in and hike our 1-mile 'Turkey Trail'. See if you can spot all the turkeys and receive a free native tree seedling (hiking not required to receive free tree). By planting a tree at home, you are providing wildlife with food and cover. For best results plant your tree within 48 hours.

White-Tailed Deer

Saturday, November 19 • 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Ohio's official state mammal is the white-tailed deer and the state tree is the Ohio Buckeye, so named because the buckeye nuts resemble the shape and color of a buck's eye! Learn more interesting facts during the indoor portion of this program followed by an evening stroll.

Sixth Annual-Walk Your Stuffing Off!
