COMMITMENTS AND AGREEMENTS FROM THE FEBRUARY 21, 1989, COLUMBUS MEETING BETWEEN U. S. EPA, OHIO EPA AND DOE

To summarize our discussions at the February 21 meeting held in Columbus, we have compiled a listing of the agreements and commitments from the meeting as we understand them:

1. DOE will generate a generic Work Plan for the Facilities Testing Program, which will include a description of the actions to be taken if water is encountered during the investigation.
2. *Jayne* → By June 30, DOE will provide available data from the wells in the South Plume area. By July 31, DOE will provide a proposed concept for the interim remedial actions which would be necessary in the South Plume area, with a Conceptual Design Report to follow by September 30. The target date for approval by USEPA/OEPA is October 31. *see Wan*
3. USEPA will provide the name of an individual at the Justice Department who is knowledgeable on the need for NEPA at CERCLA sites. *6/21/89 15:00*
4. DOE will explore the feasibility of a comprehensive review of the discovery documents for additional critical issues. *1/9/91*
5. DOE will provide USEPA/OEPA with the technical data supporting the DOE position that the wells at Location 71 are not necessary in the groundwater monitoring program. *1/9/91*
6. DOE will provide USEPA/OEPA with hard copies as well as a disk of the Rounds 1, 2 and 3 groundwater data at the February 28 TIE Meeting. *1/9/91*

7. DOE and USEPA/OEPA will each review their model provisions for interagency agreements and dispute resolutions, and provide that data to the other parties, so the FFCA program can be consistent with these agency policies.
8. DOE will provide USEPA/OEPA with a copy of WMCO comments on the ASI letter describing the cleaning of the outfall line.
9. USEPA will provide further information on their Bioassay program as it becomes available.
10. USEPA/OEPA agrees with DOE's proposed Operable Unit concept, and agrees to provide a written response to DOE on the proposed Operable Unit schedule.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 30, 1989, at noon, in Columbus. DOE will provide their proposed agenda for this meeting by March 15.
