CHAIN-OF-CUSTODY FOR SILO 3 MATERIAL

It is our understanding that the following was discussed and agreed upon during the Tuesday, October 1, 1991 conference call:

Silo 3 material, retrieved in 1989, which is required to perform treatability studies, did not have a standard chain-of-custody form. The material was stored in the Pilot Plant Warehouse under lock and key. Access to the sample drums was permissible only in the presence of the Facility Owner or their representative. Each drum was secured by a ring bolt and lead seal. Neither the lead seals nor the ring bolts revealed signs of tampering.

A chain-of-custody form has been developed and sample drums were transferred to ASI/IT. This material will be utilized for treatability studies.
