COMMITMENTS AND AGREEMENTS FROM THE MARCH 30, 1989 COLUMBUS MEETING BETWEEN U.S. EPA, OHIO EPA AND DOE

This letter serves to summarize the actions and commitments resulting from our March 30 meeting in Columbus.

1. WMCO is making a final attempt in negotiating license agreements for southern groundwater monitoring wells before turning the issue over to the DOE and WMCO Legal Departments.
2. USEPA-V will respond to DOE's March 15, 1989 letter on Well Location 71.
3. DOE RI/FS data transfers made in the future will be via diskettes.
4. USEPA-V committed to revising the IAG/FFCA to pattern it after the Hanford site language by the end of April 1989.
5. USEPA-V will provide a response to the K-65 Silo Sampling Plan (submitted by DOE to USEPA-V on December 30, 1988).
6. Ohio EPA approved the K-65 Silo Sampling activities in a letter to DOE dated April 10, 1989. This approval is needed to satisfy the terms and conditions in the Consent Decree signed on December 2, 1988.
7. DOE provided Ohio EPA with computer results on the radon attenuation effects due to sandfilling the silos on March 29, 1989.

8. The DOE proposed interim remedial action to control stormwater runoff in the waste pit area was generally accepted by USEPA-V and Ohio EPA. Details of the proposed action will be discussed on April 25, 1989.
9. DOE/USEPA-V/Ohio EPA agreed that the next public meeting would be in mid-May. DOE reaffirmed that they would comply with the March 27 meeting results (between DOE/USEPA-V/Ohio EPA) concerning updating the Community Relations Plan and will incorporate interim remedial actions into the May meeting if possible.
10. The group discussed the Health and Safety issues and DOE committed to provide U.S. EPA with maps of the site showing contaminated areas.
11. DOE proposed to restructure the TIE meetings to assure that information provided and feedback received can be focused towards meeting the current RI/FS schedule.
12. DOE/USEPA-V/Ohio EPA reached agreement to meet on April 25, 1989 to discuss detailed schedules and work to be accomplished on the interim remedial action proposed on March 30, 1989.
