Dear Owner:

This letter is notification that according to the Ohio EPA files, you are in violation of monitoring requirements for volatile organic chemicals (VOCs) in drinking water as set forth under the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), Rule 3745-81-24 and 40 CFR 141.24.

Specifically, the FEED MATERIALS PROD CTR is in violation for failure to have entry point D01 sampled and analyzed for VOCs within the JANUARY 1, 1994 - MARCH 31, 1994 time period.

In the event that the required analytical determinations have been performed, please notify this office immediately by mailing, to my attention, a copy of the analytical report(s) on Ohio EPA form 5019, along with a cover letter which explains the reason for the late submittal.

As a result of this violation, Rule 3745-81-32 of the OAC and 40 CFR 141.32 require that a public notice be issued by your facility informing the consumers of your water system of the violation. The attached draft public notice may be used verbatim. If any changes are to be made, telephone for verbal authorization before the public notice is issued. Return the attached verification form along with a copy of the public notice, once it is posted. Enclosed is a pamphlet entitled "Monitoring and Reporting Violation Public Notification Instructions", which explains how the public notice is to be issued.

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Rule 3745-81-24 and 40 CFR 141.24 also require a public water system to complete four consecutive quarters of VOC monitoring as scheduled. Water systems which fail to complete one or more of their scheduled quarters must reinitiate quarterly VOC monitoring until they obtain four consecutive quarters of results without detecting any of the 21 regulated VOC contaminants. Therefore, your system is required to reinitiate quarterly VOC monitoring according to the following schedule:

APRIL 1, 1994 JULY 1, 1994 OCTOBER 1, 1994 JANUARY 1, 1995

Please note this change on your current phase II/V monitoring schedule.

PUBLIC NOTICE

The FEED MATERIALS PROD CTR water system has failed to adequately monitor for the presence of Volatile Organic Chemicals (VOCs) in the drinking water as required under Rule 3745-81-24 of the Ohio Administrative Code and 40 CFR 141.24. The owners of the water system failed to monitor for the presence of VOCs within the specified JANUARY 1, 1994 to MARCH 31, 1994 time period.

Upon being notified of this violation by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, the water system is required to reinitiate quarterly monitoring for the above mentioned parameters. The FEED MATERIALS PROD CTR will take steps to ensure that adequate monitoring will be performed in the future.

MONITORING AND REPORTING PUBLIC NOTIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS

As a result of receiving a monitoring and/or reporting violation, Rule 3745-81-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code and 40 CFR 141.24 require that a public notice be issued by your facility informing consumers of your water system of the violation. The instructions below indicate how your system should issue the public notice required by this violation letter. Community systems must use the instructions marked Section I and Non-Transient/Non-Community systems must use the instructions marked Section II.

Section I. Public notification for a Community Water System can be achieved in any one of the following ways:

1. The public notice may be published in a local newspaper for three consecutive days; or
2. The public notice may be included with the water bills; or
3. The public notice may be issued individually to all consumers of the water supply by either hand delivery or direct mailing.

The notice must be issued within 30 days of the date of the violation letter. A copy of the notice must be received at the Ohio EPA Central Office, along with the attached verification form, within 40 days of the violation letter date.

Section II. Public notification for a Non-Transient/Non-Community water system can be achieved in any one of the following ways:

1. The public notice may be issued individually to all consumers of the water system by either hand delivery or direct mailing; or
2. The public notice may be issued by continuous posting in conspicuous places throughout the area served by the water system for as long as the violation exists, but not less than 14 days.

The notice must be issued within 30 days of the date of the violation letter date. A copy of the notice must be received at the Ohio EPA Central Office, along with the attached verification form, within 40 days of the violation letter date.
