

- ° – Species occasionally nests within the area

Horizontal lines show when the species are most likely to be seen. For example, the Red-winged Blackbird can be found in all months of the year; however, it is most likely to be seen February – November.

Abundance is relative to the habitat of the species and not to the area as a whole. Generally, an *abundant* species may be seen more than 75% of the time in the proper habitat at the right time of the year, a *common* species more than 50% of the time, an *uncommon* species between 10% and 50% of the time, and a *rare* species 10% of the time or less. The *irregular* species occur in varying numbers from year to year, and in some years may not appear at all.
