FERNALD CLOSURE PROJECT NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY AND PUBLIC HEARING: PROPOSED PLAN FOR REMEDIAL ACTIONS AT SILO 3

The United States Department of Energy (DOE) announces the availability of the Proposed Plan for Silo 3 Remedial Actions. Silo 3 is a component of Operable Unit 4 at the Fernald Closure Project. The Proposed Plan, which is now open for public comment, identifies a proposed modification of the current remedy for Silo 3.

DOE is proposing to revise the current remedy for Silo 3 due to changes to the waste acceptance criteria (WAC) at potential disposal facilities. Although this is the preferred alternative, DOE welcomes comments from the public. The formal public comment period begins April 30, 2003 and ends May 30, 2003. Written comments may be submitted throughout the entire public comment period. DOE will hold a public meeting to discuss the Proposed Plan for Remedial Actions at Silo 3 and accept oral or written public comments on May 13, 2003, from 6:30 to 9 p.m. at the Crosby Township Senior/Community Center, 8910 Willey Road.

Copies of the Proposed Plan for Remedial Actions at Silo 3 and other supporting information are available at the Public Environmental Information Center (PEIC) near the visitor badging trailer at the Fernald site, 7400 Willey Road. The PEIC is open Tuesdays and Thursdays. The Proposed Plan for Remedial Actions at Silo 3 is also available on the Fernald web site at www.fernalddoe.gov.
