
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

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
Cleanup Activities Visible at the Fernald Site

We just want to let you know there are several highly visible construction projects in progress at the Fernald site.

One of the most visible projects involves excavation and grading activities in a 23-acre area north of the former production area. In support of the Waste Pits Remedial Action Project, the area is being prepared for installation of a railyard to be used for onsite storage of railcars awaiting off-site shipment. This Site Rail System Improvement Project is expected to be completed in early 1997. The plan calls for stripping the area and stockpiling approximately 22,000 cubic yards of topsoil east of the process area fence and west of the north access road. Beneath the surface topsoil, an additional 23,000 cubic yards of usable fill material will be excavated for use as fill materials within the Waste Pits Remedial Action Project area, eliminating the need to develop a new borrow pit.

The draft Alternative Remedial Action Subcontracting Approach statement of work for the Waste Pits Remedial Action Project is now available at the Public Environmental Information Center, 10845 Hamilton-Cleves Road, Harrison (513-648-0164).
