Fernald Speakers Bureau


Last year the Fernald Speakers Bureau reached more than 7,000 members of the public.

Fernald's Speakers Bureau includes employees from both the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) and Fluor Daniel Fernald. Presenters visit schools, community groups, churches and other organizations upon their requests. Fernald speakers tailor their presentations according to the requester's specific needs and time constraints.


Speaking engagement topics include—but are not limited to—the following:
