Plant 6 contract to be awarded soon

Fluor Daniel Fernald plans to award the contract for the demolition of Plant 6, the former Metals Fabrication Plant, by Sept. 30, 1999. The Department of Energy (DOE) is in the process of reviewing Fluor Daniel Fernald's recommended selection. After receiving comments from DOE, Fluor Daniel Fernald will award the contract.

Waste Pits Project to test treatment facilities

Prior to processing material from Fernald's waste pits, the Waste Pits Project will feed clean, wet soil through the two rotary dryers to ensure the dryers and off gas system are functioning properly under normal operating conditions. The soil will contain the same moisture content that is expected in the pit material. IT Corp. will use the dryers to remove excess moisture from the waste pit material to meet Envirocare's waste acceptance criteria. The treatment facilities are forecasted to be fully operational and capable of treating pit material in late October. Rail shipments to Envirocare continue with two shipments planned during September. 
