Demolition Projects update

Decontamination and Dismantlement (D&D) activities continue in Plant 5, the former Metals Production Plant. MACTEC is continuing asbestos abatement and equipment removal in Building 5A. Structural demolition is progressing in Building 55A. MACTEC will continue asbestos abatement and begin dismantlement of Building 4B in late May.

NSC Energy Services continues interior transite removal, asbestos insulation removal and interior dismantlement in Plant 6, the former Metals Fabrication Plant. NSC will begin dismantling the NO_x system in Area 4 of Plant 6.

D&D work has begun on the former Industrial Relations Building (28B) and Security Building (28A). Activities are being conducted by the Fernald Atomic Trades & Labor Council (FAT&LC) and Wise Services. The FAT&LC began the effort by disconnecting utilities. Wise Services is relocating T-85 to house Security personnel that are affected by the D&D project. Demolition work has also begun on the concrete wall that connects the IR/Security Building to the Administration Building. Removal of the wall will allow for a new egress point to the parking lot. Due to the D&D work that is taking place in these locations, pedestrian traffic will no longer be able to access the Services Building or the Safety & Health Building through the former turnstile area. Pedestrians will be directed through the newly constructed egress, which is located east of the Administration Building. 
