**REQUEST TO USE STREAMLINED MANIFESTING PROCESS FOR ADDITIONAL LOCATION**

The purpose of this letter is to document your concurrence for the Waste Acceptance Organization (WAO) to use the previously approved streamlined manifesting process for an additional source area (see References 2 and 4). As discussed in the weekly Fernald Environmental Protection Agency Conference Call on February 10, 2004, we plan to use the streamlined manifesting approach for the northern portion of Area 3A, which is used as a transfer area for impacted materials from various excavation locations. All of the

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material brought into this area for transfer to the On-Site Disposal Facility (OSDF) has passed WAO's initial visual inspection, and has been tracked from the original source material tracking location.

The streamlined process consists of radio communications, field tally sheets and summary manifests for multiple loads of material with the same source, material category and placement location (see References 1 and 3). WAO limits use of this approach to one source and one cell at a time to ensure that verbal radio communications are clear and that tally sheets are accurate. To date, tally sheets have reflected zero (0) discrepancies between the number of trucks radioed to the OSDF and the number of trucks received at the OSDF. The primary benefit of the streamlined manifesting approach is that it frees WAO personnel from the administrative burden of completing hundreds of truck-by-truck manifests per day, and instead allows them to focus primarily on visual inspection of soil and debris for prohibited materials.
