Additional topics will include the dramatically changed landscape of the Fernald site and how the Visitors Center became the first building in the State of Ohio to receive Platinum certification from the U.S. Green Building Council Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design program.

At the conclusion of the indoor program you will be given the opportunity to join us on a 1-mile walk to see how ecological restoration is continually transforming the Fernald site into a haven for wildlife.
