We have reviewed the Closeout Radiological Survey Report and the Non-Radiological closeout report for Buildings 727, 782 and 783. We concur with your conclusion that these buildings meet the release criteria for radiological constituents and that non-radiological hazardous materials have been removed or are demonstrated below regulatory levels. You may proceed with demolition after receiving sample results from the independent verification contractor, assuming they are below the release limits, and upon concurrence from the State of Colorado.

Subject: Buildings 727,782 and 783 Final Surveys

The State has received and reviewed the "Closeout Radiological Survey Report for Buildings 727, 782 and 783" and the "Non-Radiological Closeout Report for Buildings 727,782,783". Our evaluation of the reports concludes that the surveys were appropriately performed and the resultant data supports the categorization of the buildings as free-releasable per the criteria set forth within the Decommissioning Operations Plan (DOP).

The reports were also reviewed by staff from the Environmental Protection Agency and concurrence with this conclusion received from Mr. Mark Aguilar of EPA.

We have also received concurrence from Mr. Art Similjin of the DOE contracted Independent Verification Team from Mactek verifying their acceptance of the report and its conclusions.

Based on these intensive reviews, verification efforts and quality assurance data, the State has significant confidence that these remaining structures in the 779 complex meet the free-release requirements of the DOP and are suitable for demolition as described within the approved demolition plan.

With demolition of these buildings, the 779 Decommissioning projects nears completion. The State Project Coordinator wishes to thank the KH Decommissioning Project staff and all associated subcontractor staff for their cooperation and hard work on the project. Particularly noteworthy was the work of the radiological survey group in completion of final surveys and preparation of clear, concise and easily interpreted final survey reports.
