
Re: Approval of Final Closure Plan for the New Sanitary Landfill at Rocky Flats

Dear Ms. Deck:

The Hazardous Materials and Waste Management Division of the Department of Public Health and Environment (the Division) has reviewed the document entitled "Final Closure Plan for the New Sanitary Landfill at Rocky Flats Environmental Technology Site (RFETS)" dated October 9, 2001, prepared by Kaiser-Hill Company, LLC. for the U.S. Department of Energy for closure activities for the "New Sanitary Landfill" located in the north-west area of the Rocky Flats Environmental Technology Site in Jefferson County, Colorado. The document describes operational plans for closure of the landfill and post-closure care of the site.

Based upon the information provided the Division approves the closure plan. However, to comply with landfill regulations, the following steps must be taken by Kaiser-Hill Company, LLC.

- Provide the Division with the closure schedule and provide notification of when each phase of closure activities will begin.
- Provide the Division with the name, address, and telephone number of the person or agency directly responsible for oversight of closure and post-closure activities at the former landfill site.
- The Division is to be notified in a timely manner of any disturbances or problems, such as erosion, subsidence, or development of nuisance conditions at the former landfill site.


- The facility shall comply with the health laws, standards, rules, and regulations of the Department, the Water Quality Control Commission, the Air Quality Control Commission, and all applicable local laws and ordinances.

The Division is authorized by statute to charge a fee for staff time spent in reviewing plans and reports on solid waste projects. The current fee is \$72.47 per hour. For this project, I have spent 4 hours reviewing the documents provided. Accordingly, an invoice in the amount of \$289.88 (4 hours at \$72.47 per hour) will be sent to you very soon.
