

#### RESPONSE TO COMMENTS REGARDING COST BREAKDOWN FOR RYAN'S PIT

This letter was prepared in response to comments received on the transmittal letter for Ryan's Pit (IHSS 109) closeout report. The comments were in regards to cost breakdown of the project (Ref. EPA letter, T. Rehder, to DOE, S. Slaten, November 5, 1997).

The first question requested information regarding the \$863K cost of excavation and thermal desorption and whether the cost was burdened or not. The question further stated that if the cost was unburdened, what would the burdened cost be. The \$863K included the burden on those activities.

A second question requested a breakdown of the unburdened cost. As you are aware, Ryan's Pit was the first source removal performed by the Kaiser-Hill team. As a result of the rapid planning and execution of projects during that time, emphasis was placed on tracking total ER projects costs rather than on tracking cost per project. Individual activities within this project were not tracked separately. As a result of this, a breakdown of the unburdened cost is not available.

Another question asked which activities were covered in the category of execution costs. Execution included excavation, treatment, field supervision, safety support, and sampling and analysis activities. Subcontractor costs were not split out by project, and the majority of work was performed by Site personnel.
