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



Dear Ms. North and Mr. Dalton:

On April 2, 1999, the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Hazardous Materials and Waste Management Division (the "Division") approved the *Final Building 788 Cluster RCRA Closure Project Demolition Plan, Revision 1.0, March 1999* (the "Demolition Plan"). The Demolition Plan describes certain activities that will be conducted at RCRA Units 21 and 48 located in the Solar Ponds area at the Rocky Flats Environmental Technology Site (RFETS). In an April 6, 1999 telephone conversation with Sandi MacLeod of DOE-RFFO, James Hindman of my staff was informed of two minor revisions that were proposed to the approved Demolition Plan. These two minor revisions were made for the purpose of clarification and do not substantively alter the requirements of the Demolition Plan. At the time of the April 6, 1999 phone conversation, Mr. Hindman granted verbal approval for those changes with the understanding that the changes would be submitted in writing. Shortly thereafter, the Division received a letter dated April 13, 1999 from DOE-RFFO with the enclosed Revision 2.0 of the Demolition Plan dated April 1, 1999 which included the changes as approved.

This letter provides written confirmation of the Division's approval of Revision 2.0 of the Demolition Plan. The following condition from the April 2, 1999 approval of the Demolition Plan remains standing. Since the concrete building slabs will remain in place after demolition activities have been completed, RFETS must ensure that any remaining fixed radiological contamination in the slabs is adequately protected by physical means to prevent future disturbances and subsequent migration to environmental media.
