Defined Position on the Siting of the Standley Lake Protection Project Reservoir

The Office of Southwestern Area Programs, Rocky Flats (RF) Branch (EM-453), has been requested to provide a position and justification for their position on the siting of the Standley Lake Protection Projects flood control reservoir. For the program to speak with one voice on this issue, assistance is needed to prepare for the justification of the Programs' position. EM-453, Programmatic Guidance and Compliance Staff, the Office of General Counsel, and the Office of Environment, Safety and Health wish to support RF on this issue.

You had been requested to prepare a decision paper on this issue and to support this decision with backup information. An issue paper on this question has been received from RF. This paper, received on July 27, 1993, clearly addresses the issue and provides some backup information on why the project could be delayed if it were sited on Department of Energy property. However, a definitive Project position is needed. Also received was a presentation of "Assessment of Alternatives to Implementing the Standley Lake Protection Project." This matrix is a good decision tool, but it does not present the Project's position. Additionally, the expected impacts presented in the matrix paper cannot be adequately defended by the Program Office without further definition.

To meet the needs of the Project Office, the Program Office is requesting that the decision paper be written. Within the decision paper a position must be presented. What does the Project want? This position must be supported with detailed backup materials. A critical path-logics diagram listing the work elements and their progression needed to accomplish the siting of the reservoir in the buffer zone as not a viable option. The work durations shown on the diagram should reflect experienced work durations when possible. This information, used in conjunction with the previously received information, would greatly facilitate the task of supporting the Project's position.
