


NOTICE OF ROCKY FLATS CERCLA FIVE-YEAR REVIEW

The Department of Energy Office of Legacy Management (DOE-OLM) is conducting a Five-Year Review of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) remedy for the Central Operable Unit (OU) at the Rocky Flats Site. The purpose of the review is to ensure the CERCLA remedy remains protective of human health and the environment. The Five-Year Review report is scheduled to be completed Sept. 17, 2007.

The Rocky Flats Site, located approximately 16 miles northwest of Denver, Colorado, was a key production plant in the nation's nuclear weapons program from 1953 to 1994. Production activities resulted in chemical and radiological contamination of surface water, groundwater, soil, and air. The plant's mission changed to cleanup and closure in the early 1990s and the cleanup was officially completed when DOE and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the state of Colorado signed the CERCLA Record of Decision (ROD) on Sept. 29, 2006.

The remedy for the Central OU consists of:

- 1) monitoring and maintenance at the Present and Original Landfills, and at the passive groundwater collection and treatment systems;
- 2) environmental monitoring
- 3) the following institutional controls -
 - a. the construction and use of buildings that will be occupied on a permanent or temporary basis (such as for residences or offices) is prohibited;
 - b. excavation, drilling and other intrusive activities below a depth of three feet are prohibited, except for remedy-related purposes;
 - c. no grading, excavation, digging, filling, or other disturbance of surface soils of any kind is permitted, except in accordance with an erosion control plan approved by EPA or CDPHE; any such soil disturbance shall re-store the soil surface to pre-existing grade;
 - d. surface water may not be used for drinking water or agricultural purposes;
 - e. the construction or operation of groundwater wells is prohibited, except for remedy-related purposes;
 - f. digging, drilling, filling, grading, excavation, construction of any sort, and vehicular traffic, are prohibited on the covers of the Present and Original Landfills, except for authorized response actions; and,
 - g. activities that may damage or impair the proper functioning of any engineered component of the response action, including but not limited to any treatment system monitoring well, landfill cap or surveyed benchmark are prohibited; and,
- 4) physical controls including signage to be installed along the perimeter of the Central OU and controls necessary to protect engineered components of the remedy, monitoring locations and survey points to ensure that they continue to function as designed.

DOE-OLM, EPA and the state of Colorado will brief members of the public and answer questions on the Five-Year Review during the May 7, 2007 quarterly board meeting of the Rocky Flats Stewardship Council. The board meeting begins at 8:30 a.m. at the Jefferson County Airport, Terminal Building, 11755 Airport Way, Broomfield, Colorado.
