

NOTICE OF COMPLETION
ROCKY FLATS CERCLA FIVE-YEAR REVIEW

The U.S. Department of Energy Office of Legacy Management has completed the third five-year review of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) remedy for the Central Operable Unit at the Rocky Flats Site. The remedy for the Central OU consists of environmental monitoring, physical controls and institutional controls. The purpose of the review is to ensure that the CERCLA remedy remains protective of human health and the environment. The third five-year review report concludes that the remedy for the Rocky Flats Site Central OU is protective of human health and the environment. The next CERCLA five-year review will be conducted in 2017.

DOE submitted the report to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Region 8 on June 23, 2012, for review, and EPA concurred with the report on July 30, 2012. The final report, dated July 2012, is available on the Rocky Flats Site website at http://www.lm.doe.gov/Rocky_Flats/Regulations.aspx, or by contacting Legacy Management at the addresses below.

The Rocky Flats Site, located approximately 16 miles northwest of Denver, was a key production plant in the nation's nuclear weapons program from 1953 to 1994. Production activities resulted in chemical and radiological contamination of surface water, groundwater, soil, and air. The plant's mission changed to cleanup and closure in the early 1990s, and the cleanup was officially completed when DOE, EPA, and the state of Colorado signed the CERCLA Record of Decision on September 29, 2006.
