We ask that this waiver include internal and external letters, work plans, reports, interim measures, RCRA facilities investigations, interim remedial actions, site characterization studies, human health risk assessments, environmental evaluations and assessments, comparative analyses such as budget information, and other environmental and administrative documentation

The mission of RPD is to assess and clean up inactive facilities and sites contaminated by wastes generated from past operations at the Rocky Flats Plant (RFP) and to environmentally restore the sites. These activities will be conducted to achieve compliance with applicable laws, regulations, and agreements aimed at protecting human health and the environment. RPD is responsible for planning, implementation, and management of all environmental restoration projects at RFP and the Oxnard Facility in Oxnard, California, and is responsible for planning and implementation of all the Department of Energy's (DOE's) Environmental Restoration (ER) Program activities at RFP. The ER Program is organized to assess and clean up contaminated sites. Its goal is to ensure that risks to human health and the environment are either reduced to negotiated levels or eliminated.

The CERCLA/Sitewide Projects group's mission is to provide planning, implementation, and management for the investigation and remediation of CERCLA sites required under the Interagency Agreement. The group provides compliance activities that include negotiations with regulatory agencies and compliance with CERCLA, NEPA, RCRA, and applicable DOE Orders, other environmental laws, agreements, and actions. The group is responsible for underground storage tanks (UST) onsite and interim remedial actions required under the Interagency Agreement (IAG). The group ensures that CERCLA requirements are met, while ensuring that risk to human health and the environment are either reduced to prescribed levels or eliminated.

The RCRA Closure Projects group's mission is to provide planning, implementation and management for the investigation and clean up of contaminated sites required under the IAG and to perform permitting and compliance activities that include negotiations with regulatory agencies and compliance with RCRA, CERCLA, NEPA and other environmental laws, orders, agreements, and
