SUBJECT: FOLLOW UP INFORMATION TO THE JULY 21, 1995 GREAT HORNED OWL
ELECTROCUTION AND SUBSEQUENT USFWS INSPECTION VISIT TO THE SITE
- MBM -102 - 95

Due to the fact that I collected the Great Horned Owl electrocuted on a Public Service Company installation on RFETS property, I was present during the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Law Enforcement officers' visit to investigate the accident. To set the record straight on this incident, I would like to make the following points:

- The electrocution occurred on a pole and associated facilities belonging to Public Service Company of Colorado, not to DOE.
- No ticket was issued to anyone at Rocky Flats, therefore there was no "Notice of Violation" for the Site.
- Leo Suazo's stated reason for writing a letter to Dyncorp was to help Mark Neeley convince management and DOE that raptor and migratory bird electrocutions is a serious compliance issue that must be addressed and remedied.
- Both Mr. Suazo and Roger Gephart of the USFWS indicated a willingness to make one or several site visits to help Dyncorp and RMRS Ecology to identify potential problem areas, and to recommend solutions based on their experience in this area.

After our meeting with the USFWS on this matter, I wrote a report memo to C. S. Evans to inform her of the outcome of the meeting. A copy of this memo is attached.
