### **Con Murphy Named Fluor Fernald Closure Project Director**

CINCINNATI - Today, Fluor Government Group (FGG) Vice-President for Environmental and Nuclear Operations, Gary Coxon, named Con Murphy as Fluor Fernald Inc.'s Closure Project Director. Murphy succeeds Jamie Jameson in leading the completion of the Department of Energy's Fernald Closure Project, formerly known as the Feed Materials Production Center. Fernald produced uranium "feed" material used in the country's nuclear weapons program. During the course of four decades of metals production, the 1,050-acre site became radioactively contaminated. Since December 1992, Fluor has been managing the over \$4 billion project, which is now on course to complete all cleanup, soil certification and site restoration by spring 2006.

Murphy has served the past year as Fluor Fernald's Field Closure Project Director. In this capacity, he was responsible for all field operations reporting directly to Jameson. Prior to joining Fluor, Murphy spent seven years as Shaw Environmental's project director at the Waste Pits Project. Murphy has over 30 years of environmental related project management experience. Murphy has successfully and safely managed three major site closure projects during his career, including the Times Beach Thermal Remediation Project in Missouri. In addition, he served as Project Director for the Sikes Disposal Pits Site in Texas, and the Mesquite Lake Resource Recovery Project in California.

"Con knows this project, the customer and Fernald stakeholders. He is well prepared to lead the project through completion of remaining critical path activity and the final steps of closure," said Coxon.

Jamie Jameson will continue to play a vital role in ensuring final completion of the project he has led the past four years. He will be available to assist Con and DOE as needed in addressing significant issues that may arise in the final months of this project and to leverage Fluor worldwide resources to support safe, early project completion. In his new role, he also will be a valuable Fluor Government Group resource in business development, lending his experience and leadership to support Fluor Government Group's efforts to continue to grow new business both domestically and abroad.

"Over the past four years, Jamie has energized the Fernald cleanup and moved the project squarely down the path to closure. He put more people and resources in the field, all the while challenging project managers not to be satisfied with the status quo and to find new ways to do more. While overseeing more field work than at any time in Fernald's history, he helped build a safety culture and safe work performance record among the best in DOE," said Coxon.



Jameson joined Fluor Fernald in 1995 as Vice-President of Demolition Projects. He has over 39 years of construction and project management experience serving on Fluor projects all over the world.

The DOE's Office of Legacy Management will be responsible for the long-term care of the site once cleanup is complete.
