2. Division of Military Applications

At the request of the Division of Military Applications, a dust and precipitation sampling program was conducted at ten separate stations in nine cities in the northeastern parts of the U.S.A. Measurements were conducted from April 11th to June 15th. The results were tabulated and plotted, and a report was forwarded to the Division of Military Applications and to the Division of Biology and Medicine in Washington.

3. Herring Hall Marvin Safe Company

A survey was made at the Herring Hall Marvin Safe Company during the machining of uranium slugs for North American Aviation Company to determine hazards involved in machining operations. Of fifteen dust samples, the daily weighted exposure for a machinist was found to be approximately 0.1 of the Maximum Allowable Concentration.

4. U. S. Bureau of Mines Laboratory

Air samples were taken at the U. S. Bureau of Mines Laboratory where tests are run on the expossibility of various metal powders. The analysis of the air samples indicated that the exposure to operators was negligible.

5. Mt. Kisco Sewage Plant

A study was made at Mt. Kisco, New York, of radium removal efficiency by a standard sewage treatment plant. Mt. Kisco was chosen because of the presence of a radium bearing industrial effluent. The results showed that approximately 60% of the radium in the sewage water is removed in passage through the treatment plant.

6. Baker and Company, Newark, New Jersey

Several visits have been made to Baker and Company, Newark, New Jersey, where relatively large quantities of contaminated platinum are reprocessed to remove contamination. Air samples were taken throughout the laboratory; no significant airborne contamination was found. The greatest single sample was below the maximum allowable concentration.
