

Ref: **S.E. DRAINAGE REMEDIATION**


Dear Mr. Van Fossen;

Thank you for arranging the visit to the SE Drainage Area, Monday April 15, 1996. I realize that the remediation plans; specifically, the haul route layout has not yet been finalized. Nevertheless, it appears likely that the haul road will cross State Highway 94, which, along with several other observations, has generated concerns on my part.

The relatively small volume of contaminated soil to be removed (approximately 200 truck loads) probably does not justify a special "constructed" crossing and the planned use of flagmen should be adequate for physical protection of traffic originating from or going to Francis Howell High School. However, I understand that this activity take place during school hours. Given the relatively short duration of hauling (less than one month) I suggest that you might schedule this at times when school is not in session.

My primary concern is the generation of dust during excavation and hauling of the contaminated soil. I have not seen any information regarding dust suppression and/or monitoring during these activities. However, Mr. Lee Koehnstedt stated that these items would be addressed. Would you please forward a copy of these materials when they are developed.
