The Department of Energy (DOE) is committed to working cooperatively with the USEPA and OEPA through several iterations of the new quarterly summaries, and through ongoing development of the IEMP Extranet Site, to achieve a product that satisfies the reporting needs of all parties.

According to existing agreements, responses to comments on a previous IEMP quarterly submittal have been addressed through the enclosed comment response documents, rather than through revision of the report. This is also the case with an additional OEPA

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
