concerning the Bald Eagle issues. During the initial contact in August, Mr. Archuleta indicated that he would not be available for approximately six weeks and would have another USFWS representative contact us to schedule a site visit. No response from the USFWS has been received to date, even though we have left three follow-up messages with the office receptionist since the initial conversation with Mr. Archuleta.

In order to have this matter resolved, Rocky Mountain Remediation Services, L.L.C. recommends that DOE/RFFO request in writing an opinion from the USFWS on the operational status of the two air monitoring stations with respect to potential effects on the Standley Lake Bald Eagles. The air monitoring program was implemented to provide data for the OU 3 Human Health Risk Assessment. It is anticipated that the air monitoring stations will be operated continuously through February 1996, and possibly longer if further data is required for evaluating offsite air quality conditions.
