Ms. Moritz, Mr. Spreng and Mr. Surovchak:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) released a proposed modification to the Rocky Flats Legacy Management Agreement (RFLMA) Attachment 2, Legacy Management Requirements, for public review and comment. The public review period for these changes was extended from the initial proposed end date of August 27, 2010 to September 28, 2010.


Due to the recent additional information provided in technical meetings on September 14, 2010 by the RFLMA Parties and the significant potential impacts to downstream asset holders, the extended comment period will not provide sufficient time for our staff to fully evaluate and provide meaningful comments on the recent proposed changes.

In addition, with closure of the Rocky Flats Reading Room, more time is needed to extract technical information from Legacy Management's web site, GEMS system, and other technical documents pertaining to sampling methodologies, hydrology and data trending. Accordingly, the City and County of Broomfield requests that you extend the public

comment period on the proposed modifications to RFLMA Attachment 2 for an additional
21 days.

We look forward to your response on our requested extension of the comment period. We appreciate the opportunity to discuss this crucial document during the extended timeframe during the public comment period to work with DOE, EPA and CDPHE.
