Nancy Daugherty informed those present that there have been no changes to the list of materials since the last quarterly update (April 25, 1989).

Kathryn Schnoor presented the City of Broomfield Radiometric Monitoring Report for May. The Broomfield Water Treatment Plant was closed from March 14 to May 5. Monitoring of the water treatment plant's output resumed on May 6. All measurements were consistent with nominal environmental background radioactivity values which have been reported in the past. The report included a special summary of analytical results for samples collected on April 7, April 25, May 2 and May 25. These samples were taken from water that was diverted from Pond B-5 to the Church Ditch/Upper Church Lake drainage area on the Rocky Flats plant property. Analysis of over 40 parameters yielded no extraordinary results. Mrs. Schnoor noted that the data indicated that water from Pond B-5 had returned to the condition it was in prior to the February 28 chromium incident.

Steve Ramer presented the City of Westminster Radiation Data Monthly Report for May. An updated report of analyses performed on samples collected during April was presented with the report for samples collected during May. All measurements were normal and consistent with nominal environmental background radioactivity values which have been reported in the past.

A special summary was presented by Sharon Bernia of the City of Westminster, regarding analysis for chromium and other metals, and for volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and other organic materials in water. Results of analysis for metals were normal and consistent with expectations for any public water supply. Organic compounds were not found in any detectable amount.


Nancy Daugherty presented the May, 1989, Rocky Flats Plant Monthly Environmental Monitoring Report. A special section included results of analysis of water that was pumped from Pond B-5 to the Church Ditch/Upper Church Lake drainage area on the plant property.

Robert Terry presented the May, 1989, Colorado Department of Health Environmental Surveillance Report on the U.S. Department of Energy Rocky Flats Plant. All data which were presented in the report were within expected ranges and were consistent with measurements which have been taken at the same sampling locations in the past.

There were no announced changes to the monitoring programs.

There were no special agenda items.
